CITY COUNCIL REGULAR MEETING

MAY 6, 2024 6 p.m.

ROLL CALL Present: Councilmembers Shelley Friedrich, Willard McKinley, Jason Strough, and Mayor Scott Testory. Absent: Councilmember David Walsh.

Also, in attendance: City Manager Sue McLaughlin, City Clerk Angie Wanserski and City Attorney Joe Chamley.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE TO THE FLAG

PRESENTATION

PUBLIC COMMENT William Walsh was in attendance to discuss with council the police department's presence on I74. He would like council to know that his preference is to have the officers available to Farmer City residents instead of patrolling the highway. Mr. Walsh also brought up barking dogs. The city has an ordinance on the books and he is asking for more enforcement of this issue if possible.

MOTION by McKinley, seconded by Friedrich, to approve the consent agenda. Voting yes: McKinley, Friedrich, Strough and Testory. Motion carried.

NEW BUSINESS

- A. Discussion regarding truck parking at 605 W Market.
 - Joe Carter is asking council to provide him with a variance to the current ordinance which prohibits the parking of vehicles in residential areas that are over 8000 pounds and exceed 20 ft in length. Mr. Carter is currently parking his work truck at his property and it is eroding the right of way. Council is willing to agree to the variance if Mr. Carter signs an MOU with the following conditions: the situation will be reexamined annually, Mr. Carter agrees to the cost of repairs to the b-box should he hit it and Mr. Carter will maintain the ROW by laying rock at his own expense.
- B. Approval of contract between IMEA and the City of Farmer City.

 This contract was discussed at the April 1, 2024 council meeting. It was agreed that IMEA has represented Farmer City well and it working hard at the diversification of energy sources.

 MOTION by McKinley, seconded by Friedrich, to approve the contract between IMEA and the City of Farmer City. Voting yes: McKinley, Friedrich, Strough and Testory. Motion carried.
- C. Ordinance 1120 an ordinance accepting a bid in connection with the sale of certain real estate (N I74, W of E Clinton Ave/Route 54, Farmer City, IL 61842).
 This ordinance is in regards to the 20 acres north of the interstate. In December, the city advertised to
 - sell this property and the only bid was from Tabeling Development. In March, council approved a development agreement. This contract is the next step in the process. There are 2 parts to this contract. The 1st is for the sale of 10 acres to Tabeling Development. The 2nd, is for the right of first

refusal to purchase the remaining 10 acres. There are currently no firm plans on phase II. This contract allows the project to keep moving forward.

MOTION by McKinley, seconded by Friedrich, to approve Ordinance 1120 an ordinance accepting a bid in connection with the sale of certain real estate (N I74, W of E Clinton Ave/Route 54, Farmer City, IL 61842). Voting yes: McKinley, Friedrich, Strough and Testory. Motion carried.

D. Resolution 2024-103 approving a TIF grant to Door1 LLC in the amount of \$2558.60 for roof repairs at 210 E Water St.

Jerry and Josh Hawn are requesting TIF funds to help replace a roof at 210 E Water St. They have submitted 2 quotes with the lowest being Hawn Contracting for \$12793.00 Council has historically approved up to 30% reimbursement to other requesters and agrees to do so for the Hawns.

MOTION by McKinley, seconded by Friedrich, to amend the main motion to read Resolution 2024-103 approving a TIF grant to Door1 LLC in the amount of \$3837.90 for roof repairs at 210 E Water St, increasing the amount to 30%. Voting yes: McKinley, Friedrich, Strough and Testory. Motion carried.

MOTION by McKinley, seconded by Friedrich, to approve as amended Resolution 2024-103 approving a TIF grant to Doorl LLC in the amount of \$3837.90 for roof repairs at 210 E Water. Voting yes: McKinley, Friedrich, Strough and Testory. Motion carried.

E. Resolution 2024-104 a resolution adopting a digital sign policy.

This resolution puts policies in place on what is to be posted on the digital sign. Many cities are avoiding business advertisement and council agrees that the sign should be used primarily for city and community news only. Attorney Chamley also substantiated that posted events must be open to the public.

MOTION by McKinley, seconded by Friedrich, to approve Resolution 2024-104 a resolution adopting a digital sign policy. Voting yes: McKinley, Friedrich, Strough and Testory. Motion carried.

F. Resolution 2024-105 a resolution adopting dog park rules.

The dog park drinking fountain is being installed this month. The concrete pad will be poured after that installation and fencing is to begin in June. The city would like to adopt dog park rules now so that they can order a sign stating the requirements. Anyone who enters the dog park is agreeing to the posted rules.

MOTION by McKinley, seconded by Friedrich, to approve Resolution 2024-105 a resolution adopting dog park rules. Voting yes: McKinley, Friedrich, Strough and Testory. Motion carried.

ORDINANCE NO. 1121

ORDINANCE MAKING ANNUAL APPROPRIATIONS FOR THE CITY OF FARMER CITY FOR FISCAL YEAR 2024-2025

WHEREAS, the City of Farmer City is an Illinois municipal corporation, organized and operating pursuant to the laws and constitution of the State of Illinois; and

WHEREAS, the City of Farmer City is a municipality with less than 500,000 inhabitants and is required to follow the appropriation procedures described in the Illinois Municipal Code, 65 ILCS 5/8-2-9; and

WHEREAS, the City of Farmer City has prepared a budget containing estimated fund balances, revenues and expenditures upon which this annual appropriation ordinance has been prepared; and

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of Farmer City, DeWitt County, Illinois that:

- FIRST: The amounts hereinafter set forth, or so much thereof as may be authorized by law, as may be needed or deemed necessary and the same are hereby appropriated for the corporate purposes of the City of Farmer City, Illinois to defray all necessary expenses and liabilities of said City of Farmer City, as hereinafter specified for the fiscal year commencing on May 1, 2024, and ending on April 30, 2025.
- SECOND: The amounts appropriated for each object and purpose are as shown on the attached Exhibit A.
- THIRD: The appropriations herein made for any purpose shall be regarded as the maximum amount to be expended under the respective appropriation accounts and shall not be construed as a commitment, agreement, obligation or liability of the City of Farmer City.
- FOURTH: If any section, subdivision or sentence of this ordinance is for any reason held invalid or to be unconstitutional, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portion of this ordinance.
- FIFTH: This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption, as provided by law.
- SIXTH: A certified copy of this annual appropriations ordinance shall be filed with the DeWitt County Clerk within 30 days of its approval by the City Council of the City of Farmer City.

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF FARMER CITY, DEWITT COUNTY, ILLINOIS AUTHORIZING THE EXECUTION OF A NEW POWER SALES CONTRACT AND A NEW CAPACITY PURCHASE AGREEMENT WITH THE ILLINOIS MUNICIPAL ELECTRIC AGENCY FOR THE DELIVERY PERIOD COMMENCING OCTOBER 1, 2035

WHEREAS, the Illinois Municipal Electric Agency ("IMEA" or the "Agency") is a body politic and corporate, municipal corporation and unit of local government of the State of Illinois organized under the Illinois Joint Municipal Electric Power Act, 65 ILCS 5/11-119.1-1 et seq. (the "Act") as a municipal power agency, and it provides electric power and energy and related services to its member municipalities that own and operate their own municipal electric utility and electric distribution systems; and

WHEREAS, the Agency was created as a means to achieve economy, adequacy and reliability in the supply of electric power and energy by planning, financing, owning and operating facilities for the generation and transmission of electric power and energy and related facilities or other facilities necessary or convenient for the planning and operation of a system for the production and transmission of electric power and energy thus making it possible for its member municipalities to achieve economies and efficiencies not possible for municipalities acting alone; and

WHEREAS, the City of Farmer City is a municipality owning and operating a municipal electric utility and electric distribution system which furnishes retail electric service to the public in its service area, and the City is a member of the Agency; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Farmer City and the Board of Directors of the Agency have previously approved, and the City and the Agency have heretofore entered into a long-term Power Sales Contract, as amended, pursuant to which the Agency provides and the City purchases the full requirements of power and energy needed to meet the load obligations of the City's municipal electric utility and electric distribution system; and

WHEREAS, the existing Power Sales Contract, as amended, is set to expire on September 30, 2035; and

WHEREAS, under the Power Sales Contract, as amended, the Agency has full responsibility for planning and obtaining an adequate supply of power and energy for the City and other Agency members; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Farmer City and the Board of Directors of the Agency have previously approved, and the City and the Agency have heretofore entered into a Capacity Purchase Agreement, as amended, pursuant to which the City has dedicated the behind the meter generating resources owned and operated by the City to the Agency's control and use; and

WHEREAS, the existing Capacity Purchase Agreement, as amended, is tied to and matches the term of the existing Power Sales Contract, as amended, through September 30, 2035; and

WHEREAS, in furtherance of its obligation under the Power Sales Contracts, the Agency plans for and takes all necessary steps to ensure a resource portfolio to meet the long- and short-term power and energy needs of the City and other members ("Participating Members"), including participation in and ownership of baseload generating resources, ownership of and Capacity Purchase Agreements with Participating Members that own behind the meter generating resources, entering into long and short term bilateral contracts with power suppliers for the purchase of capacity and energy from new and existing thermal, renewable and non-carbon generating resources, and participation in and purchases of capacity and energy from markets maintained by the Regional Transmission Organizations that control the regions where the Participating Members are located; and

WHEREAS, the electric industry in Illinois is undergoing a transition away from traditional thermal resources in favor of renewable and non-carbon generating resources; the Illinois General Assembly has passed new laws encouraging the development of renewable and non-carbon generating resources and restricting emissions from thermal resources; and traditional thermal generating resources have been retired or will be retiring due to age and emissions restrictions; and

WHEREAS, in light of this changing environment, the resource portfolio to meet the needs of the City and other Agency Participating Members will likely be primarily through contracting for capacity and energy from new renewable and non-carbon generating resources; developers of new renewable and non-carbon generating resources require long-term commitments for the purchaser of the output from these projects in order to finance and build such resources; typical financing by developers is currently for 20 to 25 years; in the short-term if developers are willing to contract for the shorter period that the Agency has remaining on its existing Power Sales Contracts, the pricing will necessarily be higher to allow the developer to finance the project and be assured of collecting its development and operational costs over the shorter period; in the long-term, if the Agency waits to begin supplementing its resource portfolio, it is anticipated that the cost of construction of new projects will increase making even full 20 to 25 year power supply contracts more costly; and

WHEREAS, in order to plan for and ensure that resources are in place to continue to meet the long- and short-term power and energy needs of its Participating Members, including the City, and to continue providing reliable, affordable, and sustainable power now and in the future, the Agency needs to provide for the continued contractual relationships with the Participating Members beyond September 30, 2035; without a firm commitment from Participating Members beyond September 30, 2035, the Agency will not be able to continue to ensure that resources are in place at favorable prices; and

WHEREAS, the Agency must also provide for the continued availability of the existing and future behind the meter generating resources owned and operated by its Participating Members as part of its resource portfolio beyond September 30, 2035; and

WHEREAS, the Agency Staff, with the input of a working group consisting of members of its Board of Directors, has developed the form of a new Power Sales Contract and a new Capacity Purchase Agreement, commencing immediately upon the expiration of the existing agreements, the form of which are attached hereto and incorporated herein; and

WHEREAS, upon approval of this Ordinance by the City of Farmer City, the City and the Agency are agreeing to the continuation of the full requirements power supply relationship between the City and the Agency and to the form and terms and conditions of the new Power Sales Contract and new Capacity Purchase Agreement with Illinois Municipal Electric Agency for the delivery period commencing on October 1, 2035; and

WHEREAS, based upon the foregoing facts, the City by this Ordinance hereby finds and determines to accept and approve the new Power Sales Contract and the new Capacity Purchase Agreement with Illinois Municipal Electric Agency for the delivery period commencing on October 1, 2035.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FARMER CITY, DEWITT COUNTY, ILLINOIS, as follows:

Section 1. The findings and determinations set forth in the preambles to this Ordinance are hereby made findings and determinations of the City Council of the City of Farmer City and are incorporated into the body of this Ordinance as if set forth in full.

Section 2. The City Council of the City of Farmer City hereby accepts and approves the new Power Sales Contract with Illinois Municipal Electric Agency for the delivery period commencing on October 1, 2035, which commencement date is immediately upon expiration of the existing Power Sales Contract with Illinois Municipal Electric Agency, as amended, in the form presented and agrees to be bound by the terms and conditions thereof. A copy of such new Power Sales Contract is attached hereto as Exhibit A and incorporated herein by reference.

Section 3. The City Council of the City of Farmer City hereby accepts and approves the new Capacity Purchase Agreement with Illinois Municipal Electric Agency for the delivery period commencing on October 1, 2035, which commencement date is immediately upon expiration of the existing Capacity Purchase Agreement with Illinois Municipal Electric Agency, as amended, in the form presented and agrees to be bound by the terms and conditions thereof. A copy of such new Capacity Purchase Agreement is attached hereto as Exhibit B and incorporated herein by reference.

Section 4. By this Ordinance, the Mayor of the City of Farmer City is hereby authorized and directed to execute and deliver and the City Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to attest and seal a new Power Sales Contract, substantially in the form of Exhibit A, and a new Capacity Purchase Agreement, substantially in the form of Exhibit B.

Section 5. By this Ordinance, the Mayor of the City of Farmer City is hereby further authorized to take all steps and execute any and all other documents and agreements reasonably necessary or appropriate to implement and administer the new Power Sales Contract and the new Capacity Purchase Agreement approved hereby.

Section 6. All Ordinances and parts of Ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby superseded.

<u>Section 7.</u> This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage.

A RESOLUTION APPROVING AN EXISTING TOPOGRAPHIC SURVEY AS FINAL PLAT FOR SUBDIVISION

- WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Farmer City, DeWitt County, Illinois, pursuant to the authority conferred by the Statutes of the State of Illinois, established certain standards and procedures for review and approval of subdivisions within the Corporate Limits of the City of Farmer City, Illinois and within one and one-half miles thereof; and

(Professional Design Firm #184.005091) ("Survey"), for review and approval by the City of Farmer City as a Final Plat; and
- WHEREAS, the City Manager reviewed the various documents submitted and made recommendations concerning approval of said Survey as a Final Plat; and
- WHEREAS, No waivers from the standards and procedures set forth in the Subdivision Ordinance has been requested by the Developer; and
- **WHEREAS,** the Mayor and City Council met and reviewed the Survey as the Final Plat, and has found that it is generally satisfactory and in the prescribed form.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FARMER CITY, DEWITT COUNTY, ILLINOIS that:

The Mayor and City Council does hereby **APPROVE** the SURVEY, and hereby authorizes the Mayor, City Clerk and City Manager, as appropriate, to sign the Certificate of said Plat indicating said action and to take all other action necessary to carry out the intentions of this resolution.
